PGY2 Program Purpose: PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

Requirements for Completion of PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency

| Orientation and Licensure |
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| Present a copy of pharmacy license to RPD and upload to PharmAcademic Present a copy of PGY1 program certificate and upload to PharmAcademic Review and accept program policies with RPD and document acceptance in PharmAcademic |
| Goals and Objectives |
| Obtain “achieved for residency” (ACHR) on at least 85% of required objectives without any “needs improvement” Obtain ACHR on 100% of objectives determined as essential to the practice of psychiatric pharmacy Complete and upload all required residency deliverables in PharmAcademic Complete and document all required appendix disease state topics in PharmAcademic Provide contact information and employment information prior to end of residency, if known |

| Present program-specified research project at local, regional, or national meeting (ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting, etc.) Present research findings at MidSouth Pharmacy Residency Conference (or acceptable alternative as determined by RPD) Complete research manuscript that is ready for publication Complete Authorization for Authorship form attached to manuscript with advisor and RPD’s signature Close IRB submission, if project not to continue |
